SPORTS PREMIUM

The government is providing further funding for the academic years 2019-20 to support new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and has seen more money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school has received £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil each year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional Change4life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/Sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/Sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs.

Vision

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objectives

- To achieve self sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools
- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

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Sports premium successes and impact review 2018-9

This year at Oldswinford has been a resounding success as we have continued to build upon our sound base of health and sporting activities. We have continued to provide high quality CPD curriculum training to all staff through the use of expert coaches and a newly embedded PE scheme. Our pupil sports leaders have continued to work with children across all year groups, seeking to make break times more active and purposeful and the uptake of places in extra-curricular clubs and activities continues to be strong. We have continued to add extra support to our teaching of swimming with considerable success and our school has represented enthusiastically in sporting competition.

Pleasingly, the culmination of all this hard work has been the awarding of the Bronze school games mark to the school. Next year, we plan to forge ahead and aim for silver or gold.

Extra-curricular sports participation

This year 48% of children (200 approx) took up places in extra-curricular sports clubs, including children from all seven year groups. Sports covered included multi-skills, girls' and boys' (for all age groups) football, tennis, netball and cross-country running.

Primary sports leaders scheme

Altogether 60 year six children were trained successfully as sports leaders, initiating and running a wide range of sports activities for other children around the school at lunchtimes. Leaders were also given a uniform of purple tabbards to further increase their status.

Swimming success

Swimming lessons and coaching success meant that 46 children out of 60 (current year 5) are now able to reach a 25m or above target in their swimming assessment, many of these in more than one stroke. Majority of the remaining children achieved a minimum of 10m.

Current year 6 data (survey): 92% of children are able to swim at least 25m, 92% of children are able to complete at least 25m using more than one stroke competently. 77% of children feel able to perform safe self-rescue in water-based situations.

Sports coverage

Cricket training was introduced as a new extracurricular club to compliment existing ones (boys football, girls football, cross-country running, netball, tennis, multi-skills) and an extremely successful sports day encompassed events for all abilities from obstacle and skipping races to sprinting and long distance.



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Participation in competitive sport

Teams represented the school competitively in football, netball, and mixed cross-country.

Quality training in delivery of PE for teachers

Support in the improved delivery of the PE curriculum for rolled out to all year groups (reception to year 6) and 14 members of teaching staff. New 'Complete PE' online scheme was embedded to support the planning and delivery of PE across all year groups. It is a complete scheme that includes planning and video-clips to help teachers.

Improvement in quality of PE equipment

PE resources and classroom resources were improved and bolstered. Particularly resources like skipping ropes, tennis balls, creative dance equipment to encourage active classroom/break activities.

Spending Plans 2019-2020

This year, Oldswinford CE Primary School will receive approximately £20,000. Having evaluated the impact of the Sports premium of 2018-19, we have decided to prioritise our spending to build upon and consolidate sport at Oldswinford accordingly: Our intention is to improve the status of our school games mark to at least silver and to increase participation in extra-curricular activities to at least 50% of the school population.

- Continuing to extend our existing programme of support for curriculum based PE which includes the provision of a further swimming coach for year 3 and 4 children. This has helped to differentiate the groups and allow more proficient swimmers to progress at a faster rate. It has also helped to increase the confidence and capabilities of less confident swimmers. **Cost £700 approx.**
- Input from Sports Plus Professional sports coaches to include:
 - Sporting and physical activities each lunchtime on a Monday and Friday. Including Lunchtime football league, extra curricular sports clubs and mini-skill games.
 - 2 x 1 hour clubs after school on a Monday and Friday.
 - 2 x 1 hour PE lessons on a Monday and Friday.
 - For a full academic year.
 - This includes:
- ❖ Setup and execution of a physical assessment plan that can be used for improved assessment of core skills in PE.
- ❖ support in increasing the impact of targeted PE sessions and areas of CPD
- ❖ Tournaments and event support
- ❖ Signposting of Gifted and Talented children
- ❖ Training of Sports leaders in Key stage 2 (children from year 5 & 6) to support sport and fitness activities at lunch time, sports days and inter house tournaments.



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- ❖ Medals and certificates for extra-curricular clubs.
 - This company will offer a wide range of different sporting activities for children to experience, taught with a high level of expertise. **Cost £9,000 approx**
- Purchase of resources to support Healthy lifestyle and active classroom initiatives such as the daily mile, healthy skipping, improving performance, active breaks and classroom (skipping ropes, tennis balls, stopwatches etc) **£1000 approx**
- Equipment purchased to support and replenish PE equipment and/or purchase playground fitness equipment : **£1000 approx.**
- New kit to support competitive sports teams (football, cross-country) **£500 - 1000 approx**
- Targeted inset for staff to support curriculum initiatives and PE curriculum **£250 approx**
- Expansion and consolidation of variety of curricular and extra-curricular sports and healthy lifestyle activities across the school (eg cross-country, volleyball, netball, yoga, tennis, dodgeball, rugby, cricket etc) utilising links with community sporting clubs. **£3000-4000**
- Membership of Sports organisations and maintenance of sporting subscriptions (eg DSSA, YST) **£900**
- Transport hire to support attendance at competitive Sports tournaments **£1000**
- Funding for key staff to attend PE and Healthy lifestyle CPD courses **£500 approx**



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
